Top science, media and architecture institutions open doors for international drawing festival

This October, arts education charity The Big Draw, teams up with a record number of partners to create an extensive programme of free drawing events as part of its annual international festival, The Big Draw.

From 1 to 31 October, The Big Draw festival is celebrating its 15th year with a month-long programme of activities on every continent, including hundreds of free events for all ages created by an extraordinary range of organisations UK-wide – from nursery schools to national museums.

Highlights include:

- 1. The Big Draw 2015 public launch with Children's Laureate Chris Riddell illustrating live a Philip Pullman story read aloud by the celebrated author as part of a free all day event in the Weston Library, Bodleian Libraries, Oxford. Other contributors include internationally exhibited artist Patrick Tresset and his three talented drawing robots; artists Adam Dant and Tamarin Norwood. Additional activities across nine partner venues include an invitation to sign-in with a drawing to the world's longest visitor book, master classes, 3-D drawing, a loop the loop wall to ceiling drawing, animation, and even drawing with bows and arrows. A free drawing trail will connect all participating venues (19 September, Oxford).
- 2. The Big Draw's first Architecture Drawing Day will be launched in partnership with the RIBA (10 October, London) and supported by an exciting series of workshops to encourage different approaches to drawing buildings and places. An evening event will see special guest hosts architect Will Alsop and artist Patrick Vale challenge their audience to a BIG architectural sketch-up (6 October, RIBA, London).
- 3. Drawing the World with UAL's Central Saint Martins, Quentin Blake's House of Illustration and King's Cross will take over Granary Square with an epic drawing of the world made by 30 postgraduate students and directed by Stephen Farthing RA via drone and mobile phones, a 'Ready Steady Colour your dinner' tent with singing waiters and more (11 October, London).
- 4. **Seeing Closer** with **The Royal Society** is where art and science overlap to enable fascinating invention and discovery. With talks, historic engraving demonstrations and free activities for all ages, from making takeaway smartphone microscopes to creating microscopic drawings with the **Gurdon Institute** team (17 October, London).

5. **Light Fantastic: Adventures in the Science of Light** at the **National Media Museum** is a free half-term extravaganza exploring art and light as the culmination of the Light Fantastic season. There will be *Light Drawing*, *Digital Doodling*, opportunities to *Draw Differently - Ask the Experts*, with top tips from Aardman Studios storyboard artist, **Jay Clarke** (24 October – 1 November, Bradford).

The arts education charity – The Big Draw – is the creator and driving force behind the annual, international Big Draw festival. Launched in 2000, the festival promotes the belief that drawing changes lives for the better, and its mission is to give everyone an opportunity for self-expression through the universal language of drawing. The charity champions visual literacy and highlights the importance of creativity in education, literature and society. In 2014, 414,000 participants took part in over 1800 Big Draw festival events in 26 countries.

Sue Grayson Ford, Big Draw Founder and President, commented:

"Drawing allows us to interpret, invent and communicate; it helps to develop individual creativity and breaks down cultural and generational barriers. The Big Draw festival celebrates drawing's social, economic and health benefits, and our highlight events demonstrate drawing's vital role across all disciplines. The Big Draw Festival Launch

1. 19 September 2015, 11am-5pm in the Bodleian Library's Weston Library, Oxford OX1 3BG and across the city, renowned author Philip Pullman, and Children's Laureate Chris Riddell, will launch The Big Draw 2015, the 15th international drawing festival, at a free public celebration connecting nine of Oxford's leading cultural venues in an explosion of creativity. This kicks-off hundreds of events across the UK and on five continents, encouraging an estimated 400,000 people to pick up pencil, paint brush, chalk, crayon, charcoal or stylus in order to observe, design, invent, and communicate – through drawing.

- 6 October, 7-8.40 pm: <u>Picture This!</u> RIBA, 66 Portland Place, London W1B 1AD
 Special guest hosts, architect Will Alsop and artist Patrick Vale, challenge their audience to a BIG architectural sketch-up, where interpretation, imagination and speed are key.
- 3. **10 October, 10am 5pm: The RIBA launches The Big Draw's first Architecture Drawing Day,** to celebrate both the joy and challenge of drawing places, and the importance of drawing in the building and design professions. This inaugural annual event is an invitation to explore architecture in different ways, from <u>Drawing through a Lens</u> with a DIY camera obscura and taking it on a sketching tour, to <u>iPad drawing workshops</u> in the <u>RIBA's Palladian exhibition</u>.
- 4. **10 October, 11am 4pm:** RIBA Explore & Draw workshop at Chiswick House. Everyone can join in, whether attending any of the above or not, by sharing drawings of places and buildings CAD drawings or quick neighbourhood sketches using the hashtags **#bigdraw** and **#architecturedrawingday** on Facebook, Twitter and Instagram. The RIBA and The Big Draw will share favourites throughout the day.

7. **24** October-1 November – *Light Fantastic: Adventures in the Science of Light*, at the National Media Museum, Bradford is a free half-term extravaganza exploring art and light as the culmination of the *Light Fantastic season*.

- 8. **Drawing Differently:** Ask the Experts Drop-in for top drawing tips from special guests, including Aardman Studios storyboard artist, Jay Clarke. Discover why drawing is essential to a wide range of professions and find out which careers value creative skills in a week-long programme supported by Arts Council England.
- 9. **Light Drawing** visitors can draw with light and photograph their creations for the Museum's online gallery (booking may be required).
- 10. *Digital Doodles* simple computer coding workshops to create a picture with pixels (booking may be required).
- 11. **31 October,** *Noise Orchestra: Play the Collections*: The *Light Fantastic* artists' residency finale offers a spectacular live light and sound show. Artists-in-residence David Birchall and Vicky Clarke have been converting beautiful paper stencils of Museum objects into electronic sound frequencies which will be used to create a grand final symphony. Families can also visit the artists' experimental drop-in lab throughout half term week to make and 'play' their own paper sculptures.
